Survey of IRAC Members

- Confusion over differences between MSU and IRAC resistance databases
- Improvements needed, particularly for the IRAC database
 - Searchable data with filters
- Need to have an overall update from Mark at the end of each season
- We really don't have enough data to support an interactive map feature

Discussion with Mark Whalon, MSU

- The databasing system they use is extremely outdated
 - Upgrade to new platform on Cloud
 - Much easier to update and make changes and much less expensive
 - One-time fee of \$20,000 to upgrade

Changes to Database

- Split-screen with MSU database on one side and IRAC database on the other
 - Equal billing of both databases
 - Clear explanation of each database
- “Call out buttons” to improve searchability
 - Status
 - Impact
 - Species
 - Location
 - IRAC MOA (both number and name!)

Changes to Database

- “State of the State” report each year to update IRAC on status of resistance and important changes from year to year
- Contract with expected outcomes
 - Mark was not opposed to making a contract outlining expected outcomes for the upgrades to the database that must be completed to receive the funding

Increase in Funding

- Currently, IRAC-US and IRAC International pay Mark Whalon \$15,000 per year to maintain the Resistance Databases and publish their Resistance Newsletter
 - Alternated \$5K and \$10K between IRAC groups
- Mark has requested and increase to \$17,500 this year and \$20,000 for years beyond

Decisions

- One-time funding of \$20,000 for upgrade of database to new platform and to make the requested revisions
- Increase in yearly funding from \$15,000 per year to \$17,500 this year and \$20,000 for each year after that
